Areas for improvement, recommendations

- Professionalism course might be organized on a regular basis.
- The specialization is not completely fulfilled as no deeper studies nor research nor practical application of principles are requested or checked.

Mutual recognition

There are 96 fully qualified AST members. They may be classified into 3 categories:

- Qualified in prior system "MS in Actuarial Science plus actuarial work experience" (45+10 members)
- Passed all SEGEM exams (13 members)
- Qualified abroad and passed level 4 SEGEM exams (3 members)
- Passed some treasury exams (25 members).

While the first three categories would be acceptable to meet AAE core syllabus requirements, it is not clear how to treat members which have not passed all levels of exams. This should be discussed further as they comprise up to 30% of fully qualified members.

Professionalism course was taken by 81 AST member (out of total 160). It needs to be covered before the MRA can be applied.

Conclusions

The actuarial exams in Turkey are administered by Treasury in three levels with a total of 13 examinations, which cover such areas as mathematics and statistics, financial mathematics and economics, insurance and risk analysis. These exams cover most of AAE core syllabus requirements for generic technical skills, actuarial technical skills and actuarial applications. Professionalism subject is covered by an additional course (first one was organized in November, 2016). General skills are covered implicitly in line with other skills, however, there is no evidence for covering the specialisation requirements.
