The Actuarial Association of Europe admits its 33rd Full Member Association

Brussels, 7 November 2018: The Actuarial Association of Europe is pleased to announce that it has admitted the Actuarial Society of Turkey (“AST”) - [Aktüerler Derneği Türkiye](#) - as its 33rd Full Member Association. The AST was established in 1951, has a membership comprising 159 fully qualified actuaries and is currently led by President Taylan Matkap.

The AST objectives include: increasing the recognition of the actuarial profession in Turkey; enhancing the knowledge of members of the profession by providing education, training and promoting research; responding to requests from official agencies; and resolving disputes between the members of the profession fairly.

Admission as a Full Member follows a thorough process that includes a review of the applicant association’s education program; code of professional conduct; formal discipline process; and, where applicable, formal process for the adoption of standards of practice. The AAE Education Committee reviews each of these documents to ensure compliance with AAE requirements and determines whether the education requirements for a particular association or programme meet the standards set down in the AAE Education Syllabus and Guidelines

This activity contributes towards achieving the AAE’s strategic objective to promote a European community of actuaries.
