Actuarial Association of Europe elections

Brussels, 14 October 2024

The Actuarial Association of Europe (AAE) has announced the results of its latest elections.

Following the 50th General Assembly held on 11 October 2024, **Jette Lunding Sandqvist** of Denmark was re-elected to continue serving as a member of the AAE Board until October 2027. Jette originally joined the AAE Board of Directors in January 2023 and is now eligible to serve an additional three-year term.

Birgit Kaiser of Germany has been elected as the new Chairperson of the AAE Professionalism Committee, succeeding Christophe Heck from Switzerland. Birgit, who has held the role of vice-chairperson for the past six years, will serve her first term as Chairperson until October 2027, with the option to continue for a second and final three-year term.

Rafael Moreno Ruiz of Spain has been elected as Chairperson of the AAE Education Committee, taking over from Henning Wergen of Germany. Like Birgit, Rafael has also served as vice-chairperson for six years. His first term as Chairperson will extend until October 2027, with the possibility of continuing for a second three-year term.

Finally, **Eugenija Bieliauskiené** of Lithuania and **Wilhelm Schneemeier** of Germany were elected as members of the AAE Nominations Panel. They will succeed Jana Zelinkova from the Czech Republic and Maitane Mancebo from Spain.

The AAE wishes to thank those leaving for their unlimited commitment over the last years and wishes all elected success in their new or extended role.
