

Author instructions for The European Actuary

The European Actuary is a digital magazine written for a broad audience of corporate board members, politicians, actuarial professionals, and captains of industry in the European financial and actuarially related arena.

For The European Actuary there are three possibilities of articles:

1. A regular article, on two pages, contains 900 words.
2. Shorter articles (on one page), which contain 600 words.
3. A short contribution (half-page) contains no more than 300 words.

The Editorial Board decides where an article will be placed, and how long it will be.

The articles under 1. and 2. will be accompanied by a professionally made photo (300 dpi, jpg)

Further:

- Articles to be submitted in the form of plain text (no *italics*, **bold** or underlining), preferably in Arial 10 pts.
- The title and the subheadings can be done in bold.
- Please submit illustrations in separate (eps or Excel) files, plus an indication in the text where about they should be incorporated. Try to minimize the number of illustrations for better readability. If too many illustrations are used the Editorial Board may decide to skip some of them. Illustrations must be submitted in the original source documents so that they can be edited by the layout department.
- Please try to avoid the use of footnotes as much as possible.
- Articles in The European Actuary must be understandable for this broad audience; strict mathematical or technical articles must be rewritten.

The Editorial Board will review all articles and revise them where necessary. Revised articles will be sent back to the author for approval only if the changes are substantive. After layout, a PDF will be shared with the author solely to check for any typographical errors and to give final approval. This PDF is not intended for further changes to the article content.
